This is a topic which has ramification for the elderly infirm as well as for troubled young folk (New Zealand has one of the highest rates of youth suicide in the world). We will be sharing views in an open way, not setting out to formulate a group attitude. You are welcome to join the established members of the group for this important discussion.

A RETURN SPEAKER at Open Education, JIMMY McLAUCHLAN from Methodist Mission brought us up to date with progress in establishing the YOUTH TRANSITION HOME, for which planning has been has been a priority for several years. The House finally opened in February and despite a slow start is now full. It caters for youth who for any number of reasons are adrift, cut off from family and facing an uncertain future. People from the churches and commercial firms have been most generous in furnishing the house so that it is now a warm, comfortable and safe place. Normal stay is 12 weeks, but can be extended, and during that time the Mission staff and other helping agencies provide practical and emotional support to help change the direction of young lives. A remarkably encouraging project by the Mission which has attracted support from Government and other local interests.
