PUBLIC ISSUES FOR PARISH NEWSLETTERS & BULLETINS 28 April 2018

There's a growing buzz about the Sustainable Development Goals. They give us guidelines to achieve 'no' poverty, quality education, to look after land and soil, for sustainable fishing and marine life, and to be responsible in how we produce goods and what we buy.

The SDG's are for everyone, and for the first time include developed and wealthy nations like Aotearoa New Zealand along with developing countries. Poverty is rife here, as well as in poorer countries and our rivers are polluted with intensified dairy farming.

The 17 Sustainable Development goals are a whole – they show that each area of life affects other areas – people and land, air and oceans, water and energy and cars and food all work together as one system! And in Aotearoa NZ we are developing new systems to work towards 'no' poverty, reduce pollution and use renewable energy.

One of the Goals is 'Partnerships' – an opportunity for churches to join with different organizations to work with the Goals.
