STORIES FROM THE MISSION

<u>Little Citizens:</u> *Milton*: During the month of April we introduced the tooth brushing programme with Nicky Grant, Oral Health Promotions advisor coming to the centre and introducing this to the tamariki and kaiako. The tamariki have been regularly brushing their teeth after lunch at the centre.

We took the tamariki for a walk to see the local war memorial and look at children's books about ANZAC day.

The centre received positive feedback and praise from MOE Early Intervention regarding the relationships MLC formed with Tokoiti school and support with the transition of a high needs child from the centre to the school.

<u>Corrections:</u> Literacy and Numeracy: This month we have been powering through the Virtual Reality course, and we are finding that students who before resisted the ILN course are now attending fairly regularly. Alongside the technology, however, there is still a place for the more traditional way of doing things. As a change of pace, one of my students has been making great progress with confidence and vocabulary while challenging the tutor to games of Bananagrams. He is finding great pride in making up ever longer and more complicated words, especially if they are longer than any the tutor has made. Interest in the VR course remains high, and it is rare that we are not approached at least 2-3 times a session by students wanting to take part.
