Some Key Points from the May Parish Council Meeting

We reflected that the Parish has challenges around property and money which are a challenge, particularly the increasing burden of Insurance. We need to work together as one Parish community in facing these challenges.

We warmly endorsed an application to the PAC by MMS for a grant of \$15,000 for the Otepoti Rangatahi Hardship Fund, which makes grants to enable young people to move on from transitional housing to independent living with security and dignity.

We noted the successful and positive joint service on Pentecost Sunday led by the President. We noted a strength and energy in coming together and encourage attendance at the next joint service at Mosgiel on 30th June. We noted that there will be a Synod meeting at Mosgiel on 8th June, if you are interested in attending, please speak to David.

We reflected that our structures for decision making, and oversight are inherited from perhaps over 50 years ago, we are fewer in number and older, do the structures we have meet our needs at this point in time?
